To graduate - Must be in good standing with the University, have at least a 2.33 major GPA, and pass MFT in Business.

Submit Application for Degree one year prior to graduation (Fee paid to Cashiering & form submitted to Registrar's Office).

Longwood will recommend a student for a Virginia teaching license in Business Education if the student achieves:

- A passing score is reported in all relevant portions of PRAXIS I & II
- The grade in student teaching is a "C" or above
- The overall grade point average is at least 2.50, and
- The grade point average for the professional semester is at least 2.75

Students may seek an add-on endorsement in Marketing Education by taking MARK 387, completing a marketing internship, & passing Marketing Endorsement of PRAXIS II.
