

6th Annual Longwood University Summer Literacy Institute: Literacies for 21st Century Learners July 16-17, 2009

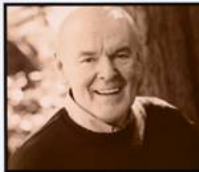
Thursday Keynote - AASL President & VEMA Past-President Ann Martin



Ann Martin will open the Institute with her keynote session, “**Navigating Literacy for a New Generation**,” addressing various forms of literacy and how educators can equip today’s students with the tools they need to be successful 21st Century Learners. Ann, author of *Seven Steps to an Award Winning School Library Program* (2005), has received many awards including the Longwood University Professionals Who Made a Difference Award (2008), AASL National School Library Media Program of the Year (2002), and Virginia Tech Excellence in Education Award (2000). In addition to her duties as AASL

President, Ann currently serves as an Educational Specialist, Library Information Services, in Henrico Public Schools.

Award-winning author Richard Peck will provide entertainment and enlightenment during his Thursday afternoon workshop, “**The Story as the Teacher’s Best Tool: Bringing the Story and Young Readers Together**.” At the Thursday evening banquet he will speak on “**Books That Bring Families Together: Real Books in the Age of Facebook**.” Richard is the author of over 30 novels for children and young adults. He has won various awards, including the Newbery Medal (2001) for *A Year Down Yonder*.

Its prequel, *A Long Way from Chicago*, was a Newbery Honor book (1999). Other awards include the National Humanities Medal, the Margaret A. Edwards Award, the ALAN Award for Outstanding Contributions to Young-Adult Literature, and the Edgar Award. His latest books include *The Teacher’s Funeral: A Comedy in Three Parts* (2004), *Here Lies the Librarian* (2006), and *On the Wings of Heroes* (2007).
