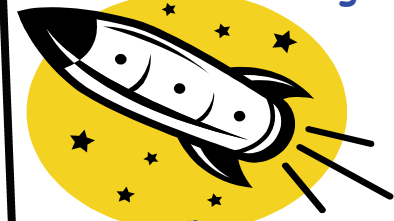

Research strongly supports that the early literacy skills children demonstrate *at the end of kindergarten* are highly dependent on the skills *they bring with them to kindergarten*. In other words, children who arrive at kindergarten with a strong sense of the alphabet, who understand how print works, who understand that sounds can be represented by letters, and who can learn by listening to stories and books will have much more success becoming readers themselves than children who do not have these skills at the beginning of Kindergarten.

Who: Children ages 3 1/2 to 5 will have an opportunity for an intensive focus on emergent literacy learning!

Where: Longwood Center for Communication, Literacy, and Learning, Third and Main Street, Third Floor, Farmville, VA.

What: Daily interactive sessions conducted by graduate students in Communication Sciences & Disorders, supervised by certified speech-language pathologists

When: Tuesday through Thursday, June 30 – July 30, 9 - 11:45 am, daily

Why: To promote learning related to:

- Naming the letters of the alphabet
- The sounds that letters make
- How print "works"
- Representing an idea through drawing and pretend writing
- Comprehension of words and ideas in story books

These areas of emergent literacy knowledge have been identified by the National Early Literacy Panel as the five prongs of an effective early literacy focus that can have a preventive effect on future reading problems.

Requirements

- Sessions:

Session I, **June 30-July 9**, Tues. thru Thurs.

Session II, **July 14- July 30**, Tues. thru Thurs.

Children may attend either Session I or Session II OR both Sessions!!

- Expectations:

Children will need to be available for a one-hour (approx.) assessment session on either June 24 or 25.

Children should be able to work in both small and large groups

- Registration:

Space is limited to 8 participants for each session.
