Internship Credit

- How many credits can students take for Goal 15?
Answer: 3 credits minimum maximum: 15 credits, but only the first 6 will count toward grade point average calculations
- How many hours are needed to complete the internship?
Answer: 120 hours minimum; 600 hours maximum
- Do you allow students to get paid in addition to being granted academic credit?
Answer: Yes
- When can students participate in an internship/guided field experience/directed research experience?
Answer: Anytime during the year
- What are the pre-requisites before completing an internship:
Answer: 18 credit hours at Longwood and a minimum 2.6 GPA
- What course do students register for if they are completing an internship?
Answer: SOCL 492, ANTH 492, CRIM 492

Once you have completed the internship, reflect on the experience by following these department guidelines: Students enrolled in 6 or fewer credits of internship must complete the following assignments: (1) submit a project describing where they did the internship, what type of work is done there, what they did in internship, and what they learned; the format of the project is discussed with the internship professor. Student may decide to create a powerpoint presentation, create a poster display, or use some other creative medium to represent what they did on their internship. Students submitting the best projects, as recommended by their internship professors will be invited to participate in a campus-wide internship event during the academic year to share their work with others on campus and the Board of Visitors; (2) keep a daily log of their internship work, describing what they did and analyzing their activities using concepts and theories from their major whenever possible; (3) write a 2-3 page typed paper in which they describe what they learned at the internship, what they liked most about the internship, and what they liked least.
