The Longwood University Department of Sociology, Anthropology, and Criminal Justice Studies invites applications for two positions beginning Fall 2010. The first position is a tenure-track Assistant/Associate Professor position, depending upon qualifications. The successful candidate will possess a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or a related discipline. Applicants who are ABD with a firm defense date will be considered.

Position two is a Lecturer/Assistant/Associate Professor, depending upon qualifications. Minimum qualifications for the rank of Lecturer is a Masters Degree in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or a related discipline.

Applicants for both positions must be generalists in Criminology/Criminal Justice who will teach lower level and upper division undergraduate courses (including some combination of social problems, corrections, and policing) as well as courses in the graduate program. Successful candidates will be expected to advise students and be involved in other professional activity. Longwood's Criminal Justice program has approximately 150 undergraduate majors and 30 masters candidates.
