

Diversity Bingo

- I. Dimensions of the Wellness Wheel:
 1. Community builder
 2. Emotional
 3. Cultural
- II. Description of Program:
 1. Distribute bingo sheet to all residents, along with directions on how to play.
 2. Residents must get to know each person on the hall in order to find out if one of the blocks from the bingo sheet pertains to another resident.
 3. The object of the program is each participant must get all the blocks signed by another resident of the hall. They cannot lie.
 - i. Example: If Bob is playing the game and he wants to fill up the "I am a military brat" square, he must find someone from the hall that is from a military family and that person must sign that square.
 4. The resident with most completed bingo sheet wins.
 5. Give out prizes to winner (optional).
- III. Learning goals for the program:
 1. To help the residents on the hall to get to know each other.
 2. This is a good game to play at the beginning of the year when people do not know each other yet.
 3. To educate the residents about diversity with in the hall and help them to come to an understanding that everyone is different.
 4. Rearrange the program to coincide with the building's learning plan.
 5. Have fun and meet learn about new people.
