- Culminates in a supervised experience in a school library.
- Requires a professional portfolio which documents mastery of program standards.
- With successful completion, meets current eligibility requirements for the Virginia Postgraduate Professional License with a endorsement as a school librarian in grades PreK-12.

Admission Requirements

- Graduate of a four-year regionally accredited college or university.
- 2.75+ undergraduate GPA* (on 4.0 scale)
 - *options available if you do not meet this requirement
- Personal essay of 500 words or less.
- Two recommendations related to your competence and effectiveness in your academic and professional work.
- Valid Virginia teaching license or equivalent from another state.
- Official transcripts from each college or university from which you earned a degree or additional course credit following the conferral of your degree.

No more than nine Longwood non-degree graduate hours may be counted towards a degree or professional endorsement. Students are expected to apply to a Longwood graduate program prior to enrolling in classes. At the latest, all application materials should be received before the completion of six hours.
