Duration: 8 weeks (May 17 – July 9, 2027)

Student stipend: \$3500 + \$500 food allowance (+ housing)

You are cordially invited to apply to LU-PRISM (Longwood University Perspectives on Research In Science & Mathematics), our residential summer research program. This program combines practical training in specific research techniques with activities designed to put the research into the context of larger goals of modern science, technology, health, and mathematics.

Undergraduate scholarly research is one of the most important things you can do to distinguish yourself from other students applying to graduate schools, professional schools, and post-baccalaureate employment. Don't let this opportunity pass you by! Apply today!

The program looks to fund 8 traditional seats in the program. Due to the parallel nature of the faculty application process, you will need to provide your discipline of interest and we will attempt to pair you with a project in that field. The faculty mentors will choose student researchers, but we will be using your qualifications and discipline(s) of interest to find students that best fit their work.

Student eligibility requirements:

1. Students in any major are eligible.
2. Student must be a continuing Longwood undergraduate in Fall 2027.
3. Students who have previously participated in PRISM are not eligible.

Application instructions:

1. Prepare a response to the following: Provide a brief summary of your career goals and describe how your education and training has prepared you for these goals. Describe how participation in this program will help you attain your career goals. Limit to one page, single spaced. Save your response as a pdf file.
2. Save a copy of your unofficial transcripts as a pdf file. You can access your unofficial transcripts through myLongwood.
